



MASTER OF SCIENCE IN SPECIAL EDUCATION

The University of Miami Department of Teaching and Learning, consistently ranked among the top graduate programs in curriculum and instruction by Academic Analytics, is seeking qualified applicants for its Master of Science in Education (M. S. Ed.) degree with a concentration in Special Education.

This degree prepares individuals to work with students with disabilities in collaborative school environments. The course of study consists of 30-36 credits over six terms (one year that includes two summers). The program accommodates both working teachers and individuals seeking initial teacher certification in special education.

There is **70% scholarship** opportunity sponsored by the School of Education and Human Development. The School makes these awards at the same time as final admissions decisions are made.

Qualifications for Consideration for Master of Science Program

In order to be considered for admission, applicants must:

- ▶ Have an undergraduate grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- ▶ Take the GRE or apply for a waiver based on 3 years teaching experience

Application deadline is **June 1st** for fall admission and **November 1st** for spring admission.
